Eric --

THANK YOU! For your submission to Mission Statement. And congratulations, because you have been selected to develop a full proposal.

I also have news that I'm excited about and hope you will be too. The development office has decided that the student bar should be in the Diego gallery, not the café, due to its larger space and higher profile location. In addition, the change of venue means there will be a week to install the bar, not just 36 hours. If you were counting on elements that exist in the café, such as tables and chairs, please note that in your proposal and we will find a work-around together.

Here's what your full proposal should include:

- 1) A proposed budget. What are your materials going to cost? Where will they come from? Don't forget costs like sales tax.
- 2) Logistical details. How will your work get installed in the time allotted? How will it get de-installed? How many people do you need to do that work? Do you need equipment such as projectors, or other equipment that SFAI might own or be able to borrow for you?
- 3) More on your vision. If your vision has changed or gotten more detailed since your original submission, please provide an updated description of what it is.

In addition, I have a few logistical concerns I want to raise. Some are minor; some maybe less so.

First, we won't actually be charging for beverages, and (a smaller point) there won't be a full bar. It could be a wine bar serving a few types of wine, or you could invent a specialty cocktail to be served, but it won't be a full bar. I can imagine asking for money as a donation to a scholarship fund or something like that, but just to be clear – people won't be paying for drinks generally.

Secondly, I'm concerned that people will be quite averse to entering their annual income onto a device of any kind. I can imagine that you'd lose a significant proportion of people at that step, and that you would raise feelings of suspicion among even those who choose to participate. Is this an intentional element of the piece? Or do you disagree? Can you think of another way to get at the ideas that interest you?

Finally, can you say a bit more about how the work relates to the idea of "mission statement?"

Please remember that the artistic vision is yours, and I don't want to undermine it in any way. My intention in asking these questions is to support the piece.

Do the best you can. With the budget, for example, it's not necessary to provide exact retail prices plus sales tax on every single material you will need. It would be great if you can do that, but it's not required. What's most important is to illustrate that you've thought through what your costs/materials will be, and that you have a realistic ballpark sense of the dollar amounts involved.

Same thing with the logistics. You don't need to provide a schedule down to the minute at this stage, but it's important that you spend time thinking about how you're actually going to get the work done, and illustrate that you have a grasp of what will be necessary.

As promised, you will receive \$100 upon submission of your detailed proposal.

The deadline for this proposal is March 19.
